SOCIAL WORKER

The Haisla Social Worker will provide a broad range of services and support role that requires flexibility and collaboration with other service providers and caregivers, such as Elders Centre, family physicians, hospital personnel, child protection staff, the community school and school district staff, band social development, band youth and family workers, community health representative, community health nurse, Health Centre personnel, early childhood educators, and others.

Social Worker:

- Reports to the Health Manager;
- Provide direct services through group work (child/parent/family) in the areas of cultural connectivity, self-esteem, parenting, stress management, problem solving, conflict resolution, effective communication, and social skills enhancement, overall mental health and wellness;
- Provide assertive case management services for adolescents who have or are at risk of developing mental health issues;
- Incorporate traditional healing practices.
- Participate and partner with other service providers in the planning and delivery of prevention, early intervention, and risk reduction programs;
- Provide liaison, consultative and educational service to other service providers on behalf of Haisla Nation membership;
- Assist Haisla Nation membership to navigate the social service network of care by linking children, youth, and families to the appropriate services in the area;
- Provide information to the community about Aboriginal child and youth mental health services as well as mental health issues;
- Link with the clinicians in a case identification or therapeutic follow-up service;
- Complete all documentation requested by the Program Manager accurately and in a timely manner;
- Attend all professional development training opportunities as requested by management;
- Follow HNC Personnel Policy and Manual;
- Provide outreach to Haisla members in the greater Kitimat/Terrace area.

Qualification / Experience

- Extensive knowledge of Aboriginal community, culture and social issues;
- Bachelor's degree in Social Work or Child and Youth Care with two or more years' experience delivering prevention, early intervention, and/or risk reduction programs preferably to Aboriginal children, families, and/or communities;
- Ability to research and acquire knowledge of the culture and traditions of the Haisla Nation.
- Demonstrate a working knowledge of the Mental Health Act;
- Demonstrate a working knowledge of the DSM-IV;
- Demonstrate effective and respectful communication at all times;
- Computer skills;

- Clear Police Information Check.
