At the recent Haisla Nation Committee/Council meeting held on June 27, 2023, the following appointments were made:

- Alex Grant Jr. was appointed the Deputy Chief Councillor and Chair of the Executive Committee.
- Greg Smith was appointed the Chair of the Stakeholder Relations Committee.
- Byron Grant was appointed Co-Chair of both Committees.

Haisla Nation Council is the elected decision-making body that sets the overall direction of the Haisla Nation in economic, organizational and community planning. Two Committees are branches of Council and together all councillors make up the Executive Committee and the Stakeholders Relations Committee.

The Executive Committee: The Executive Committee acts as an intermediary body to ensure that the operational side of the organization is performing in a satisfactory way through monitoring. The role of the Executive Committee is to set the expectations and monitor the performance of Administration. The Executive Committee is accountable to Chief and Council. Its primary responsibilities include developing/proposing recommendations to Council and tracking the performance of administration, ensuring expectations are being met.

The Stakeholders Relations Committee: The Stakeholders Relation Committee's role is to develop recommendations and action plans to put forward to Council for consideration. As the name suggests, they work with external groups and stakeholders with a mission to foster the creation of positive, sustainable economic opportunities to benefit Haisla members.

The Committees meet regularly. To streamline process Committee meetings are held together allowing for a better use of time and efficiency. In this streamlined process, all Duly Convened Council meetings immediately follow the Committee meetings.

- 3** Senior management reviews the submissions and following policy makes recommendations to the Committee and/or Council if required.
- 4** Follow up response to community member.

- The student must not have a failing grade in any of their courses
- Work habits are important. Any student who earns an "N" (Needs Improvement) will not be eligible
- The academic award given is either the honor roll or the principal's list, not both
- The school will be able to supply you with the GPA if needed
- If the course does not have a credit value attached to it, it will not be used as part of the calculation (e.g., Resource, LCTU, Distance Education Support Block, Grad Transitions Support Block, Spare)
- Must be submitted within 30 days of report card release.





Weekly Update

Category 2 and 3 open fire prohibition remains in effect throughout the Northwest Fire Center. Total forest fires are currently at 42. Our fire zone is rated at a high fire danger level so please be safe!!

Campfires are currently permitted throughout the Bulkley, Skeena and Cassiar fire zones. Things to keep in mind with campfires:

- avoid having a campfire when it's windy.
- use a proper fire pit or make a ring of rocks.
- ensure campfire is at least 3 meters away from trees, shrubs, structures and/or debris.
- do not leave campfires unattended for ANY amount of time.
- ensure the ashes are cool to the touch before leaving the site.

Very exciting times here at the firehall. The summer students have started at the firehall so you will be seeing us around the community in our pumper truck. We have a total of 16 volunteers and are very close to having a second paid position filled in our firehall as well. Of the 16 volunteers 7 have experience and 9 are new. We are working on basic firefighting training for the new volunteers. We just need to keep up with practices to ensure a good, strong team. We have set a goal to train and practice for the next year doing drills to attend the firefighting Olympics next summer in Kamloops BC.

Our team is working on a plan to help protect the Nation from forest fires. We have been working with the Northwest Fire Centre to set up a time and place to send our volunteers to be fully trained in forest fire fighting. We will share the final plan with our membership once it's finalized and our training is complete.
