### **LONGTIME EMPLOYEE RETIRES AFTER 46 YEARS**

Karen Smith began her time with our organization in 1977. Her son was two years old when she returned to the workforce. Karen has seen many changes during her time as the Postal Clerk and has remained a team player, transitioning through all the developments of the organization. One big change was the name of her employer. When she first began working the organization was known as Kitamaat Village Council (KVC) and as she retires it is now known as Haisla Nation Council (HNC). In the early years of her employment be it rain, sleet or snow, Karen made the 28 km return trek to the Kitimat Post Office in town to pick up our community's mail; returning to our Post Office to then sort and deliver that day's correspondence. This process eventually evolved over time as Canada Post made changes internally and the mail started being delivered daily. For the most part the little post office on Haisla Avenue, next to Sunahead Avenue, was where Karen spent many hours working as the Postal Clerk, with the exception of when it was moved temporarily to the Haisla Recreation Centre.

Karen will be remembered for her smile, her laughter, her welcoming "hello!" to community members and her homemade candies.

A luncheon was held on August 31, 2023, to congratulate Karen on her retirement and to wish her well as she starts a new chapter.

#### Overview

The new EDC will play a major role in the economic self-sufficiency of our Nation. Through its success, the Nation will be empowered with the monetary resources required to attain its cultural, social, spiritual and environmental goals.

HNC has learned a tremendous amount from the previous EDC's and has drawn inspiration from successful Indigenous communities corporations, learnings which have been considered by independent experts who we've engaged to ensure the most effective model for the benefit of all Haisla members.

#### **Our Values and Vision**

The vision for the EDC has been developed in alignment with the Haisla Nation's core values and will support the Nation to achieve it mission and vision.

"Our mission is to build a powerful, prosperous and proud community, healthy in mind, body and spirit."

The values of the EDC are divided into three core principles and reflect the attributes that are most important to ensuring the effectiveness and sustainability of the EDC's operations.



#### Accountability

The EDC will establish clear targets for individuals and business units, which will be continuously monitored and updated.



#### Transparency

Through regular, transparent reporting, the EDC will improve stakeholder understanding of ongoing economic development activities.



#### Sustainability

The EDC will act as a steward to the Nation, prioritizing financial and environmental sustainability above all else.

#### 1. Why do we need an EDC? Why Now?

With increased funds from major projects, partnerships and business development, an EDC is imperative to foster sustainable growth for long-term prosperity. Some examples include:







Our economic development team, third party advisors, including financial and legal experts, agree that the time is now to establish the right structure to ensure Haisla Nation's economic interests are managed effectively to maximize benefits for our people for the long term.

#### 2. How will the EDC impact me?

Nothing will change in terms of how benefits and revenue sharing accrue to the Nation and are distributed to members. The only change will be a more focused entity whose sole purpose is to ensure Haisla Nation members benefit from increased economic opportunities that have been afforded to our Nation.

The new EDC will report to a Board of Directors who will take direction from HNC, and there will be increased information sharing and transparency for Haisla members.

#### 3. How will Haisla members be informed about the EDC?

The new EDC is committed to being transparent about its operations through regular reporting and updates that will be shared through the new EDC's website and through existing HNC channels.

### Would you like to be on the EDC Board?

The EDC will be governed by a five-member Board of Directors, reporting directly to the Haisla Nation Council. The board will comprise two HNC council members and is currently seeking a Haisla Director, as well as two independent individuals with financial and legal expertise.

### Campfire Prohibition Planned for the Northwest Fire Centre

SMITHERS – Due to current conditions, a Category 1 campfire prohibition will be put into effect for the Northwest Fire Centre. Effective at 12 p.m. (noon) PDT on Thursday, August 31, 2023, Category 1 campfires will be prohibited across the Northwest Fire Centre.

This campfire prohibition will remain in effect until October 16, 2023, or until the order is rescinded.

On August 31, 2023, the following open fires are prohibited in the Northwest Fire Centre:

- · Category 1 campfires as defined in the Wildfire Regulation;
- Category 2 open fire as defined in the Wildfire Regulation; and,
- Category 3 open fire as defined in the Wildfire Regulation

In addition to open fires being prohibited, the following activities and equipment are also restricted:

- Fireworks, including firecrackers;
- · Sky lanterns;
- · Burn barrels or burn cages of any size or description;
- Binary exploding targets;
- Air curtain burners;
- Tiki and similar kind of torches; and,
- Chimineas



### Haisla Volunteer Fire Department



This prohibition does not include the use of outdoor stoves. As per the Wildfire Regulation, an outdoor stove is a CSA-rated or ULC-rated device used outdoors for cooking, heat or ambiance that burns charcoal briquettes, liquid fuel or gaseous fuel, and has a flame height that is less than 15 centimetres tall.

The Category 1 campfire prohibition includes all BC Parks, Crown lands and private lands. Human-caused wildfires are completely preventable and divert critical resources away from lightning-caused fires.

Check with your local government or other jurisdictional authorities before lighting a fire of any size since they may have their own restrictions in place.

To report a wildfire, unattended campfire or open burning violation, call 1 800 663-5555 toll-free or \*5555 on a cell phone.


