### 2024 Committee/Duly Convened Council Meeting Schedule

Haisla Nation Council is the elected decision-making body that sets the overall direction of the Haisla Nation in economic, organizational and community planning. Two committees are branches of Council:

### The Executive Committee (EC)

• The EC acts as an intermediary body to ensure the operational side of the organization is performing in a satisfactory way through monitoring. The role of the EC is to set the expectations and monitor the performance of the Administration. The EC is accountable to elected Chief and Council, and primary responsibilities include developing and proposing recommendations to Council and tracking the performance of the Administration, ensuring expectations are being met.

#### The Stakeholders Relations Committee (SRC)

The SRC's role is to develop recommendations and action plans to put forward to the Council
for consideration. As the name suggests, they work with external groups and stakeholders with
a mission to foster the creation of positive, sustainable economic opportunities to benefit Haisla
members.

The Committees meet regularly. To streamline time and process the Committees hold their meetings together to reach their common goal of being efficient and timely. In this streamlined process, to continue with the goal of being efficient and timely, all Duly Convened Council meetings immediately follow the Committees meeting.

Monthly Committee/Duly Convened Council meetings are scheduled for the third (3rd) Wednesday of every month unless noted otherwise.

Haisla Nation Council is committed to keeping our membership informed of upcoming Committee/Duly Convened Council meetings with the following schedule of dates for 2024. As a follow-up to our previous notices to the Haisla community regarding the implementation of the Community Mailbox system, we would like to inform you that the system is now scheduled to be implemented by mid-October.

As part of our preparations, we are helping Canada Post by gathering *Address Collection Letters* from community members. It is important to note that for this process only one letter is needed per household, apartment unit, or duplex unit.

The Address Collection Letter can be filled out in the following ways:

- In-person: Visit the Haisla Post Office to complete a form with the Postal Clerk.
- By phone: For convenience, you can reach out to Eliza Bisshopp, Administration Manager, at 250-639-7501 to complete the form over the phone.

The following information will be required when you are ready to complete the form:

- Your current PO Box number
  - Note: If you currently do not have a PO Box you can state "Do not have one" for the first question.
- Your current civic address (i.e. house number and street name)
- The first and last names of all individuals receiving mail at this address
- A phone number and/or email address in case Canada Post needs to contact you for any further questions.

We are excited for the enhanced convenience and efficiency of local postal services for Kitamaat Village residents and are here to assist you with the transition.

## Safety Message from Cst. Debbie Pocock

Ya'uc' everyone,

School is about to start and this is a reminder to stay vigilant while around schools and playgrounds.

Some have asked 'Why do we have school zone speed limits?"

Until children are about 8 years old, it is difficult for them to assess if a vehicle is moving or not. When children see an approaching car, they first notice the colour of the vehicle – not how fast the vehicle is moving. Children also assume that cars can stop instantly. They do not have the ability to estimate whether there is enough time for them to cross the road. It takes a vehicle 13 meters to come to a stop when driving 30km/h. When driving 50km/h it takes a vehicle 27 meters to stop – more than double the distance.

Every year in BC, 359 children are injured in crashes while walking or riding their bike.

### The following are some tips for drivers:

- Every school day a 30km/h speed limit is in effect in school zones from 8am to 5pm. In playground zones, a 30km/h speed limit is in effect every day from dawn to dusk.
- Watch for school buses. When their lights are flashing, vehicles approaching form both directions must stop.
- Avoid distractions by leaving your phone alone while driving and watch for children walking, cycling or riding a scooter.

### Here are some teachable tips for parents and caregivers about crossing the street:

- Stop at the curb or edge of the road;
- Look both ways (left and right) for oncoming vehicles, then look over your shoulder for vehicles that might be turning from behind;
- Make sure all vehicles have stopped and make eye contact with the drivers before crossing;
- When it is clear, start crossing and keep looking for approaching vehicles.
- Walk on the inside edge of the sidewalk away from the road, to be further away from traffic. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing oncoming traffic to make eye contact with drivers.
- If outside at night or in poor weather, make sure to wear bright clothing.

Let's start the new school year by staying safe!

# Haisla United Church Facility Rental for Church and lower floor

Haisla United Church is operated by a few dedicated volunteers. We warmly welcome anyone who is able to lend a hand and assist with the Church. One of the main areas volunteers help with is conducting a walk-through with individuals who rent the building to ensure the rental agreement is adhered to.

We are committed to maintaining and nurturing this community space that many of our dearly departed Haisla community members helped build. We gather about every six months to conduct a thorough cleaning of the building. Our goal is to ensure that the Haisla United Church remains a welcoming and functional environment for all who enter its doors. We always welcome volunteers. The more volunteers we have, the more ideas we can create to ensure that the Church runs in a positive and enjoyable manner.

We are incredibly thankful for the funding we received a few years ago to renovate the building. At present, there is no consistent income to cover expenses such as electricity, heating, and maintenance. So with this in mind, we offer rentals for a variety of events, including but not limited to weddings, birthday celebrations, baby showers, and family gatherings. The lower level offers tables and chairs for seating as well as kitchen access. We offer affordable rental rates, with all proceeds going towards the maintenance and improvement of the Church. It is important for all renters to follow the agreement to ensure their damage deposit is returned.

- \$175.00 Daily rental fee, plus
- \$160.00 Damage Deposit if using the main and lower floor, or
- \$80.00 Damage Deposit for just the main floor
- \$80.00 Damage Deposit for just the lower floor

Unfortunately, due to a lack of volunteers, we cannot offer rentals during holidays.
