

## Pharmacists play a vital role in your healthcare team, providing essential services that enhance your health and well-being.

## **How Pharmacists Can Help You**

- **Pharmacists can:** Assess and treat minor ailments: <u>21 conditions</u> like UTIs, allergies, pink eye, and dermatitis.
- **Prescribe contraceptives**: Including pills, IUDs, implants, and injections (free for B.C. residents).
- Renew or adjust prescriptions: Includes emergency supplies if your prescription expires.
- Administer immunizations and injections: For flu, COVID-19, shingles, and more .
- Review medications: For individuals taking five or more medications.
- Provide recommendations: For further healthcare assessment if needed.
- **Minor Ailments Treatment:** Free for B.C. residents at pharmacies. Examples include: Skin conditions (rash, acne, fungal infections) Pain (headaches, menstrual pain, sprains) Other issues (heartburn, nicotine dependence, pink eye)

## What to Bring For The Pharmacy

- Government-issued ID (e.g., BC Services Card)
- Personal Health Number (PHN)
- Information about your coverage
