Haisla Nation Launches Community Safety Committee to Address Drug **Activity and Promote Summer Safety**

This new committee has been created in response to increasing community concerns around drug greater awareness and education, particularly during the summer when activity levels tend to be at their highest.

The Community Safety Committee will be in place for a six-month term (May to October 2025) and includes representatives from Council and staff. Its work will The Haisla Nation thanks all members who have voiced focus on:

- Supporting drug trafficking prevention efforts and providing recommendations for harm reduction strategies.
- Promoting education and awareness around substance use and community safety.
- Identifying and responding to summer safety committee: issues, including unsafe areas, suspicious activity, and opportunities to improve public spaces.
- Conducting research and planning, including consultation with public safety experts and community members.
- Providing practical and timely recommendations to Haisla Nation Council and Administration.

2025 Haisla Nation Council Meeting Schedule

In alignment with elected Chief and Council's dedication to providing membership opportunities for engagement, and considering time constraints when tackling agenda items, discussions at our 2024 Council Retreat led to a proposal that was agreed upon at the December 2024 duly convened meeting. This proposal involved adding a second meeting date to the monthly schedule. The goal of this approach is to ensure that there is ample time for both membership discussions and for addressing time limitation concerns.

Haisla Nation Council is the elected decision-making body that sets the overall direction of the Haisla Nation in organizational and community planning. One committee has been established as a branch of Haisla Nation Council, which is the Committee of the Whole (COTW).

The Committee of the Whole (COTW) serves as an intermediary body, ensuring that the organization's operational functions are running effectively and to a satisfactory standard. The role of the COTW is to set expectations and monitor the performance of Administration. The COTW is accountable to the elected Chief and Council, and its primary responsibilities include developing and proposing recommendations to Council and tracking the performance of Administration, ensuring expectations are being met. Agenda items passed at the COTW level will be addressed at duly convened meetings.

Haisla Members are welcome to attend any duly convened council meeting. For those who do not wish to attend but would appreciate a meeting summary, summaries for all duly convened meetings will be released electronically for Haisla membership via the membership portal on haisla.ca and the private membership Facebook page.

Steps Haisla Nation Council Follows Upon Receiving Letters or Emails from Community Members:

- Letter/email submissions are received by the Clerk to Council in-person, by email (dugrant@haisla.ca) or by fax (250-632-2840)
- The Clerk to Council will acknowledge receipt of the submission and provide dates of upcoming Committee/Duly Convened Council meetings.
- Senior management will review the submission and following the applicable policy will make recommendations to the Committees and/or elected Council, if required.
- Once the item has been addressed a follow up will occur with the community member.

Please be advised that Haisla Nation is actively monitoring the potential labour disruption at Canada Post, which may affect mail delivery services across the country.

With the upcoming General Election scheduled for July 14, 2025, we want to assure our membership that a contingency plan is in place to ensure all eligible voters can participate without disruption, even if a Canada Post strike occurs.

Nomination packages were mailed out to all eligible members on April 17, 2025. If you have not received your nomination form, you may:

Introducing megúgu

We are pleased to announce that a name has been chosen for the Cedar LNG vessel.

megúgu means 'Spirit of the Cedar Tree' in xa'isla. The name roots our modern-day project—Cedar LNG—in the cultural and traditional practices of Haisla Nation.

It is said that long ago, one person was given the privilege of creating beautiful tools and art out of wood. A naulakw (spirit being) appeared before Chief Legai ix in the forest and guided him carefully on how to build a canoe from a red cedar tree for the first time. The naulakw called himself megúgu.

At Cedar LNG, we are honoured to have the floating LNG vessel adorned with the name megúgu, which will ensure Haisla culture and tradition is central in all that we do.

The selection of a name for the Cedar LNG vessel was truly driven by the Haisla community from the beginning. In February 2025, Elders and knowledge holders came together to identify a shortlist of six names, with advice from the Culture and Language Department and Haisla Nation Council. The shortlist was then shared with the wider community so that all members could select their preferred name. The survey was open between March 24 and April 9 and was promoted through the Haisla members' Facebook page and through the dúti† newsletter.

We extend our sincere gratitude to the community for their suggestions and feedback that drove the naming process. Your involvement is crucial to making sure Cedar LNG will always be led with Haisla values and traditions at the forefront, today and into the future.
