Long-term Haisla Nation Employee Retires



After 35 years of steadfast service, a respected member of Haisla Community School is stepping into retirement, leaving behind a legacy rooted in commitment and care. Newly retired Stan Omejc began his journey with Haisla Nation as a laborer during the initial construction of Haisla Community School, laying the literal foundation for the place that would become his professional home. Shortly after, he joined the janitorial team, and over the decades took on multiple roles—including bus driver and head of maintenance—adapting to the evolving needs of the school and the community.

His deep connection to the school goes far beyond tasks and titles. "I've seen students of yesterday become the parents of today's students," he reflected. "It's been incredible to witness the growth and generational continuity." With heartfelt appreciation, he recalled community fundraising events, spirited sports days, and the unwavering support from residents that made school life vibrant and memorable.

"I'm proud of my work at Haisla Community School," he said. "And I hope the next generation continues to care for it as much as I have."

As for retirement plans, he's keeping it local, choosing to remain in Kitimat and embrace a well-earned chapter of rest and enjoyment.

Haisla Nation Administration, elected Chief and Council, and community extend gratitude to Stan for his decades of dedication, and wish him all the best in his next chapter.

2025 Haisla Nation Council Meeting Schedule

In alignment with elected Chief and Council's dedication to providing membership opportunities for engagement, and considering time constraints when tackling agenda items, discussions at our 2024 Council Retreat led to a proposal that was agreed upon at the December 2024 duly convened meeting. This proposal involved adding a second meeting date to the monthly schedule. The goal of this approach is to ensure that there is ample time for both membership discussions and for addressing time limitation concerns.

Haisla Nation Council is the elected decision-making body that sets the overall direction of the Haisla Nation in organizational and community planning. One committee has been established as a branch of Haisla Nation Council, which is the Committee of the Whole (COTW).

The Committee of the Whole (COTW) serves as an intermediary body, ensuring that the organization's operational functions are running effectively and to a satisfactory standard. The role of the COTW is to set expectations and monitor the performance of Administration. The COTW is accountable to the elected Chief and Council, and its primary responsibilities include developing and proposing recommendations to Council and tracking the performance of Administration, ensuring expectations are being met. Agenda items passed at the COTW level will be addressed at duly convened meetings.

Haisla Members are welcome to attend any duly convened council meeting. For those who do not wish to attend but would appreciate a meeting summary, summaries for all duly convened meetings will be released electronically for Haisla membership via the membership portal on haisla.ca and the private membership Facebook page.

Steps Haisla Nation Council Follows Upon Receiving Letters or Emails from Community Members:

- Letter/email submissions are received by the Clerk to Council in-person, by email (dugrant@haisla.ca) or by fax (250-632-2840)
- The Clerk to Council will acknowledge receipt of the submission and provide dates of upcoming Committee/Duly Convened Council meetings.
- 3 Senior management will review the submission and following the applicable policy will make recommendations to the Committees and/or elected Council, if required.
- Once the item has been addressed a follow up will occur with the community member.



HOW HAISLA NATION COMMUNICATES WITH MEMBERSHIP

Haisla Nation uses several tools to keep members informed, connected, and up to date. Each platform serves a different purpose, and together they help make sure everyone has access to the information they need.

PUBLIC FACEBOOK PAGE

This page is open to everyone and is used to share general updates with the community and public.

What you'll find: Public announcements, event notices, emergency alerts, and feel-good stories.

Why it's helpful: It's a quick and easy way to stay in the loop and share important news with a wide audience.

PRIVATE FACEBOOK GROUP (MEMBERS ONLY)

This group page is a space to share information with registered Haisla Nation members.

What you'll find: Member-specific updates, opportunities, and announcements.

Access: To join the group, membership can request an invite from communications@haisla.ca, or can have a Haisla Members who is already part of the page invite them. You'll be prompted to answer a few questions as part of the membership process. Please note: If the questions are not answered, the request will not be advanced. After 2 months, the invite will be declined. Note: Comments are turned off to keep the focus on clear, direct communication. A HN contact will always be noted on posts should members have any questions. Why it's helpful: It's a focused space for members to get updates that matter specifically to them.

Are you interested in becoming a Millwright, Instrumentation and Controls, or Electrical Tradesperson?



The apprenticeship program will include:

- On-the-job experience and work placement opportunities at the Pembina Prince Rupert facility and other Pembina facilities
- Technical training at accredited trade schools such as the British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT) in Burnaby, B.C., and Coast Mountain College in Terrace, B.C.
- Hands-on support from a mentor at Pembina facilities
- · Financial assistance and other benefits



What we're looking for:

- A desire to become a certified Instrumentation, Electrical, or Millwright Journeyperson with a Red Seal
- Completion of high school (Grade 12 or GED):

Background: In November 2024, HNC passed a formal resolution condemning drug trafficking within the community, taking a zero-tolerance policy, and establishing a comprehensive approach to address the ongoing opioid crisis. HNC's position comes following recent months that has seen a rise in drug-related crime that has threatened the well-being of the Haisla community near and far.
